

## Home Escape Plans

On Monday January 25th, Boxborough Firefighters visited classrooms in Grades K-4 at the Blanchard School and provided education on home escape plans. Students were given a homework assignment to work on with their parents and return to their classroom teachers. As a service to the community, parents will have the option of having Firefighters visit their individual homes to discuss the final plan with the entire family, as well as perform a mock fire drill, practicing a variety of escape routes.

If your child attends private school or is still pre-school age, you are still welcome to request a house visit and the firefighters will help to develop the plan on-site. At the end of the fire drill, students will also have a chance to tour the town's newest fire engine, Engine 63, in their own driveway. This program is funded through the Massachusetts Department of Public Safety's SAFE (Student Awareness of Fire Education) Grant and is provided free of charge to residents of the community.
